### What Are **Nouns** and **Verbs**?

- A **noun** is a person, place, thing, or idea. It names something.

Example: I opened the present. (noun = thing)

- A **verb** is a word that shows action or a state of being.

Example: I will present my work. (verb = doing) Example: I am excited for Summer. (verb = state of being)

### Your Task:

Below, you will find 5 sentences where a spelling word is used as either a **noun** or a **verb**. Your job is to rewrite each sentence so the word is used in the opposite way (noun → verb or verb → noun).

Example:

Original: The support from my team helped me win. (noun)
