Trip to the Tip – Year 6 Visit the Recycling Centre



Year 6 rounded off an eventful Tuesday with a thought-provoking trip to the Recycling Centre in Keynsham. Greeted by representatives from the Share and Repair organisation, the children learned about the environmental impact of electrical waste and the value of repairing rather than replacing. They got hands-on diagnosing faults in vacuum cleaners and torches, discovering just how simple and rewarding fixing things can be.

On Tuesday, Year 6 enjoyed a fantastic Greek art workshop led by Anna from the Holburne Museum, Bath. The session began with a fascinating look at how classical Greek architecture influenced Georgian buildings across Bath. Inspired by myths and legends, the children then designed and decorated their own plates, each featuring a mythical creature – half human, half animal. They completed their designs with intricate key-pattern borders, similar to those seen in ancient Greek pottery and Wedgwood ceramics. It was a creative and educational experience that brought history and art to life in a truly memorable way!
